



INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL ON GLOBAL SECURITY 2019

The International School on Global Security takes place on April 6 — 14, 2019.

Main principle of the PIR Center International School is that the future of each of us individually, our countries, safety of the regions and the world depends on ourselves as well as from our ability to define key problems, find common interests, negotiate and make realistic joint decisions.

For that reason, the course provides an extensive overview of key developments and trends in international security given by their direct participants and will walk the students through the twists and turns of new challenges and threats, as well as examine specific approaches and positions taken by Russia, other countries and international organizations to regional and global problems.

The PIR Center International School on Global Security is a unique platform where young politicians, diplomats, military and civil servants, journalists, scholars, and students expand the scope of their professional knowledge and further their education. The School is intended for those who strive to build expertise and improve professional skills and contribute to a more secure world.

The School is an excellent opportunity for those who are studying Russia and the Russian language abroad for a deep immersion in a linguistic, cultural and professional environment established by leading Russian experts in the field of international relations.

Key topics for the International School 2019:

- ◇ WMD nonproliferation and nuclear threat reduction – global and regional agenda. Future of the NPT. WMD in the Middle East. North Korea and security in East Asia. The Iran deal
- ◇ New challenges of chemical and biological safety. Future of the CWC, OPCW and BWC
- ◇ Arms control and new arms race. START, INF, missile defence, weapons in outer space
- ◇ Digital transformation, global Internet governance, information security and cyber security
- ◇ Emerging technologies – real and mythical opportunities and threats (artificial intelligence, lethal autonomous weapons)
- ◇ International law in new technological and political realities
- ◇ New trends in terrorism and military conflicts
- ◇ Russia and its neighbors, Europe, Middle East, Central Asia and Afghanistan
- ◇ Russian foreign policy and defence priorities. Russia and the West. Russia and the East. Russia and the World

Working language of the School is Russian. Participants should be fluent in both Russian and English.

Lecturers – practicing, leading Russian and foreign experts, representatives of the state organizations, research institutions and companies.

Participants. 25 diplomats, officers, young politicians, civil servants, international relations scholars, journalists, graduate students, undergraduate from the CIS countries, Europe, USA, the countries of SCO and BRICS.

Place. The School takes place in the ancient Russian city of Zvenigorod. Near the city there are unique monuments of the Russian spiritual culture, the Savvino-Storozhesky and Novoirerusalimsky monasteries, places connected with life of the Russian writers and composers, the Patriot park.

Partners. The School is organized by PIR Center in cooperation with the Diplomatic Academy of the MFA of the Russian Federation with the support of the Presidential Grants Foundation and the Alexander Gorchakov Public Diplomacy Fund. INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING AN APPLICATION TO THE INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL ON GLOBAL SECURITY 2019

Applicants who wish to participate in the competitive selection for the International School on Global Security should:

1. **FILL IN** electronic questionnaire [HERE](#) (the link is available on school.pircenter.org)
2. **SEND** to organizers at the e-mail address edu@pircenter.org the following documents:

Essential:

- ◇ Cover Letter (in Russian), in which applicants should explain their goals for participation in the program.
- ◇ Letter of Recommendation from organization's director or advisor of applicants (in either Russian or English);

Optionally applicants can submit any other materials which will allow us to evaluate the application further (CV, publication, etc.).

3. **RECEIVE A CONFIRMATION** by e-mail from the organizing committee of School that the application is accepted for consideration.

The organizers may ask for an interview with the candidate (face-to-face or by phone).

Working language of the School is Russian. Separate performances may be held in English. Participants should be fluent in both Russian and English.

The deadline for the submission of applications is **March 4, 2019**.

Organizers incur the expenses linked to the accommodation and food of the participants of the program representing the scientific, educational organizations and public authorities of the CIS countries and also provide listeners with necessary materials and literature. Expenses on journey to Moscow and back, nonresident participants are covered by the directing party. On the basis of separate applications, the PIR Center can consider the question of paying the journey to participants from the remote regions of Russia, far from Moscow, and countries of Central Asia.
