**One year ago PIR Center celebrated its 30th anniversary since it was founded in 1994.**

This is a huge and significant event for us! For three decades, we have been consistently improving our expertise in foreign policy and international security, preparing new generations of international relations professionals, developing the PIR Center Alumni Community in Russia and worldwide, being a reliable platform for international dialogue. However, this year will go down in history not only due to the anniversary date, but also due to the many significant projects implemented by PIR Center independently and with the support of partners.

**The Security Index Yearbook** was published for the first time – a large-scale project that has no analogs. The yearbook is a voluminous (575 pp.) work published in English and aimed at a foreign audience of expert community and decision-makers for a better understanding of Russian foreign policy course.

Another important debut of the PIR Center was the holding of the **1st Russian–African Forum of Young International Relations Professionals on Security and Development**. In 2024, which marks the 30th anniversary of PIR Center and the anniversary of our journal **“Yaderny Kontrol”**, PIR Center resumed publication of the edition in the format of a digital bulletin. The updated format is focused on the modern needs of the audience and combines analytical articles, interviews, reviews and various educational and information materials covering both the journalistic and research activities of PIR Center. For the first time, the publication is presented in English!

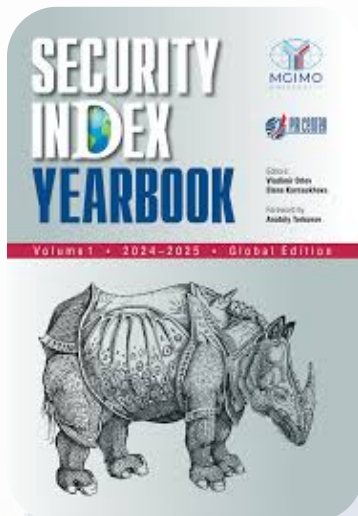

International terrorism, arms control, new types of arms, cyberdiplomacy, space security, as well as Russian cooperation with the “world majority” states.

# SECURITY INDEX YEARBOOK: NEW LEVEL OF ANALYSIS

Dr. Vladimir **Orlov**, Founding Director of PIR Center, visited Kazakhstan from **September 30 to October 2, 2024**, attending the Conference on Sustainable Development and Security in Eurasia, commemorating the 80th Anniversary of MGIMO University.

The event was honored by the presence of H.E. Kassym-Jomart **Tokayev**, President of the Republic of Kazakhstan, and Academician Anatoly **Torkunov**, Rector of MGIMO University. President Tokayev, opening the conference in Astana on Sustainable Development and Security in Eurasia, noted the “unprecedented” decline in international security, which he compared unfavorably to the Cold War period. He called for restoring strategic stability and emphasized the urgent need for a new “détente”.

At the same event, MGIMO Rector Anatoly Torkunov, in President Tokayev’s presence, underscored the PIR Center’s significant contributions in collaborating with MGIMO on key reports, including those focused on Africa and the Persian Gulf. He also highlighted the newly released *Security Index Yearbook* displayed during his presentation. The book exhibition, hosted at the Palace of Independence in Astana, prominently featured the latest joint publication by PIR Center and MGIMO, the *Security Index Yearbook Global Edition*. This event was organized with the use of the Russian Presidential Grant on the civil society

development, provided by the grant support from the Gorchakov Public Diplomacy Fund, as well as with the support of the MGIMO University due to implementation of the joint project Global Security, Strategic Stability and Arms Control (implemented by PIR Center and the MGIMO University under the auspices of the *Priority-2030 Strategic Academic Leadership Program*).

20 young specialists in international relations: diplomats, military officers, scholars, students, and journalists from Belorussia, Hungary, Kirgizia, Mexico, Russia, Tajikistan, France, and Sweden took part in the event.

key issues of both global and regional security: functioning nuclear non-proliferation regime, arms control development, international cooperation in the field of peaceful use of atomic energy and situation in the uranium market, problematics of the cybersecurity in the world politics, new technologies influence on regional and global security, tendencies of the contemporary arms conflicts, hybrid wars and transnational threats of security, the new European security agenda, etc.

The lecture "Is everything horrible? The military-political situation in the world and the factors of its aggravation" by Dr. Igor **Istomin**, Head of the Department of Applied Analysis of International Problems, MGIMO University, Member of PIR Center Advisory Board, has proceeded to pinpoint key aspects of development the current global security landscape. In his speech, Dr. Igor **Istomin** focused on the specifics of the changing world order in the past and the particulars of current transformational processes on the global stage, as well as explanations of the causes of the outbreak of military conflicts.

Subsequently, the two traditional classes by Dr. Ekaterina **Stepanova**, Head of the Group on Peace and Conflict Studies of IMEMO RAS, PIR Center Executive Board member, took place: The lecture on "Armed conflicts today and the dynamics of violence: the critical trends" and the seminar on "Peace processes."

Accordingly, two general classes were taught by Lieutenant-General (retired) Evgeny **Buzhinskiy**, Co-Chair of the *Dialogue Club International*, Chairman of PIR Center Executive Board: a lecture on "The disintegration of arms control and the transformation of strategic stability: who is to blame and what's next?" and seminar on "The contemporary arms race: participants, types of weapons, spatial dimension".

The participants discussed issues related to the causes of the collapse of the modern arms control regime and the specifics of a potentially "new" arms race.

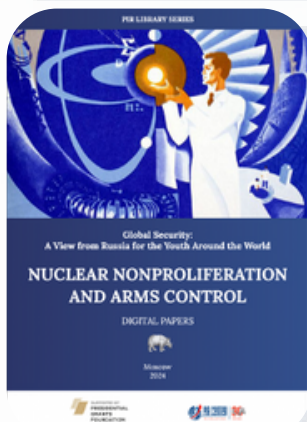

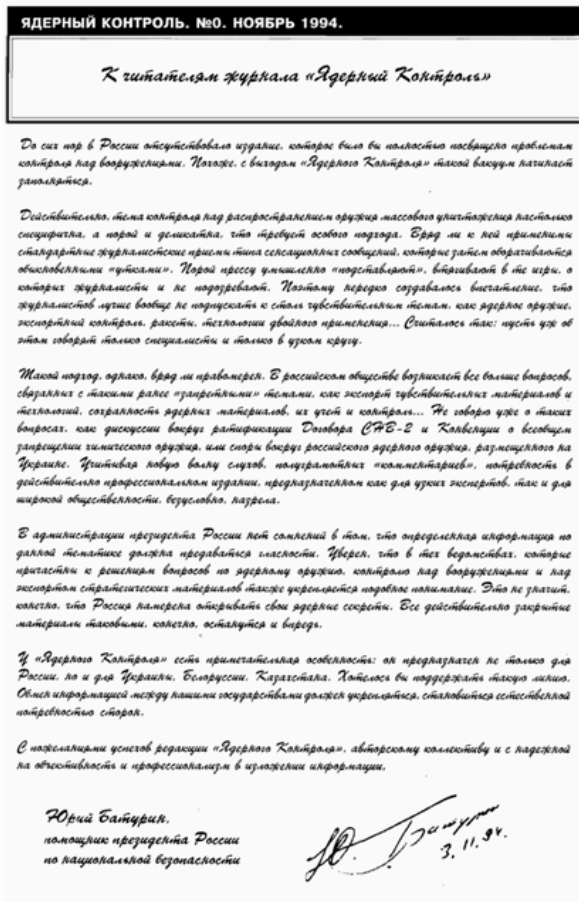

PIR Center history starts in 1994 when the organization moved to the *Moscow News Office*, placed on the crossroads of Tverskaya str. and Pushkin Square in Moscow.

In a document of the PIR Center establishment these four names were proudly mentioned: Egor **Yakovlev**, Anatoly **Torkunov**, Egor **Gaidar**, and Vladimir **Orlov**.

It is highly important to mention the PIR abbreviation history. “I exceptionally like lines in poem **Cicero** by Fyodor Tyutchev”, – Dr. Vladimir **Orlov**, Founding Director of PIR Center, postponed.

**Blessed are they who sojourned here  
In this world's fateful hours–  
For they were summoned by the angels  
As guests to a great feast**

*(Editor's note – In Russian – PIR is a translation of an English word “feast”)*



“What did PIR do in its early years, when there were no Outlooks, Sharepoints, PIR–Presses, a website, etc.? We published a journal! After all, it was born in the bosom of journalism. And everyone who knew PIR at that time, remembers, first of all, **Yaderny Kontrol**. Still, as a journalist, it was clearer for me to start with a publishing project. The first such project was the **Yaderny Kontrol** journal, a trial, zero , which was published in the fall of 1994. PIR Center began as a scientific and practical circle on nuclear non–proliferation issues, formed around the journal and, in essence, to serve the journal,” – Dr. Vladimir **Orlov**

From the office on Strastnoy PIR Center then moved to MGIMO University. “Moscow News then began to experience hard times, connected with the decline of the newspaper and the desire of its sponsors to get their hands on the lucrative building on Strastnoy Boulevard, without caring about the development of the publication,” – Dr. Vladimir **Orlov** reported with regret.



“Office No. 3039. Department of World Political Processes (*Editor’s note* – MGIMO University). Unfortunately, now there is nothing here that reminds us of PIR Center. But exactly here we moved to set up a new petit editorial office of *Yadeny Kontrol* in 1996, and it was here that the creative publishing process was in full swing day and night. It was some kind of gray office, where there was not even a secluded place to discuss salaries with people who came to us to get a job”, – Dr. Vladimir **Orlov**.

Times changed and PIR Center changed with them. Alexey **Zakharov** not only created PIR Center’s first website, but also found the next office.

A typical residential area: concrete, courtyards, ponds, and hypermarkets. Along Miklukho-Maklaya str., the buildings of Moscow universities also stretch gray. Nearby is Troparevsky Park, where a swarm of cars from all over Moscow rushes on weekends. At the intersection with Academician Volgin Street in Moscow is the Mikhail M. Shemyakin and Yuri A. Ovchinnikov Institute of Bioorganic Chemistry of the RAS.

The building, on the one hand, fits organically into the pale mass of the urban landscape, on the other hand, it immediately catches the eye with its unusual layout: it faces Miklouho-Maclay str. at an angle, standing out from the usual chain of facades. And it is not easy for an ordinary passerby to solve the architectural riddle of the structure at first glance.

I don’t really remember if there was anything remarkable in the office, but in PIR Center people were always remarkable, – Lyudmila **Balandina** pinpointed





“This office was as modern as could be”, – Vadim Kozyulin comments. – It seemed to us then that it was of European level: there was a lot of glass, metal, a greenhouse. Informal meetings, team building in style of PIR Center, also began to be held in a modern way

PIR Center is proud to have been educating a new generation of international security professionals for several years. And, indeed, many famous names have passed through PIR Center. Here, the famous military observer Dmitry **Litovkin** (1972-2022) took his first interviews, which were then translated by Dmitry **Polikanov**: “I took several texts and translated them for my first 300 dollars. I submitted the materials, signed the acts, and went on vacation. I thought that I would take the money upon my return. And that was August 1998. So when I returned at the end of the month, my 300 dollars had fallen in value significantly. When the dollar was already 20 rubles and higher everywhere, I received payment for eight rubles, I reckon. It was my first life lesson – don’t relax.”

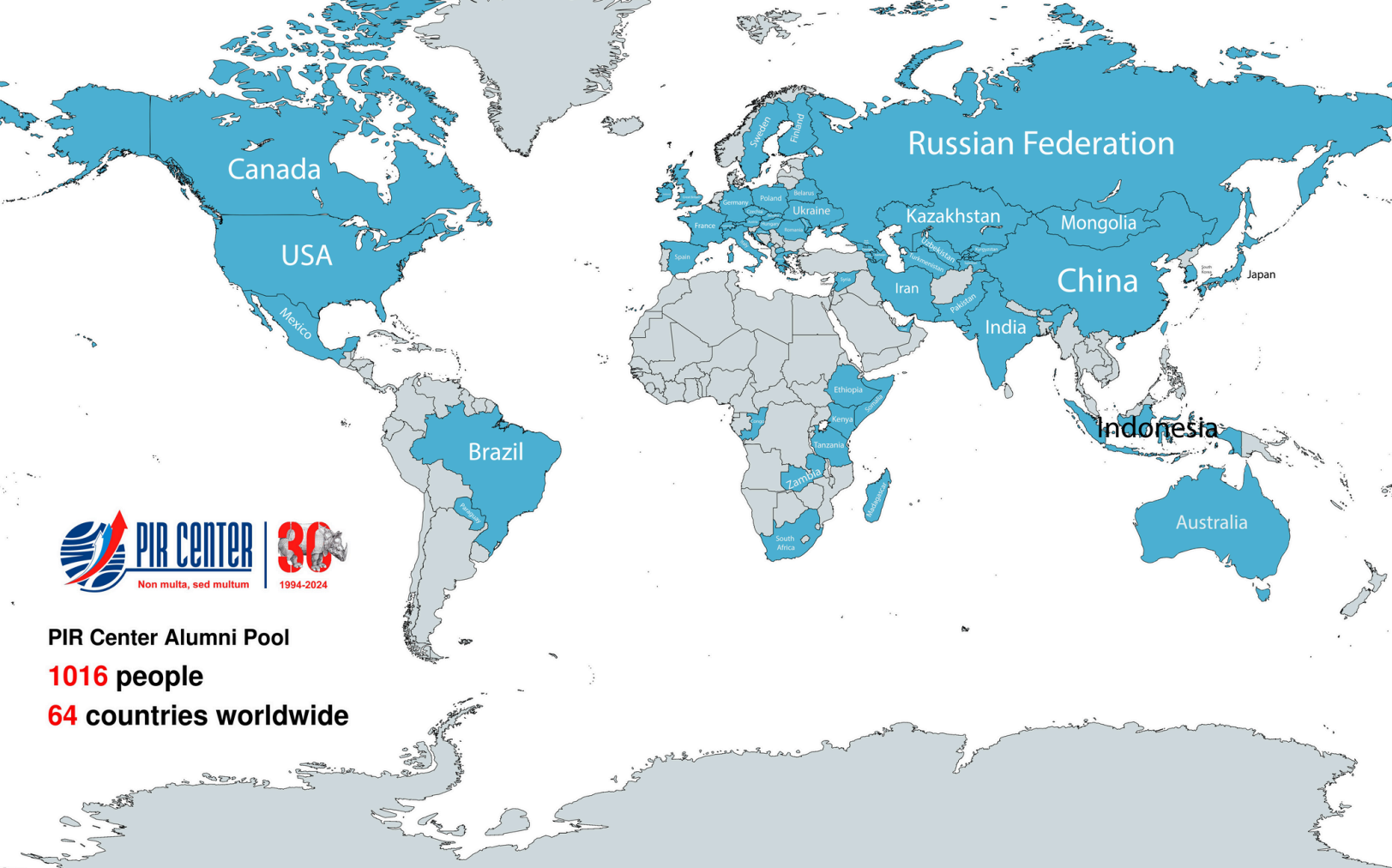

On February 2, 2024, the meeting between Dr. Vladimir Orlov, PIR Center Founding Director, Professor at MGIMO University, and H.E. Timur Zabiroy, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Russian Federation to the UAE, took place in Abu Dhabi.

During the meeting, Dr. Vladimir Orlov presented the PIR Center and MGIMO University report On Both Sides of the Persian Gulf: The Development of High-Tech Business in the Region and Russia's Interests, prepared within the framework of the joint project *Global Security, Strategic Stability, and Arms Control* under the auspices of the *Priority-2030 Strategic Academic Leadership Program*. The meeting also addressed issues related to information and analytical support of relations between Russia and the Gulf states, conducting educational and training events devoted to the Persian Gulf region and the UAE, in particular.

On March 28, 2024, seminar, devoted to the theme “International Terrorism and the Nuclear Terrorism Threat”, was proceeded in the framework of the special course of Dr. Vladimir Orlov, the PIR Center Founding Director, “Relevant Issues of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation”. 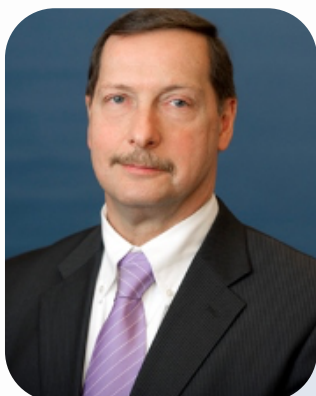

**On November 15, 2024, [PIR Center and the Ural Federal University \(UrFU\) held a joint online-discussion “The Middle East and digital technologies: development vs threats”](#)**. Event was proceeded within the framework of the 2nd International Scientific Conference “Paths and countries: civilizations of the East in the historical dynamics”.

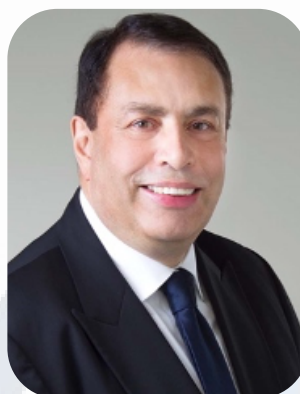
PIR Center's staff, oriental studies at the UrFU and the leading Russian universities, and representatives of academic community, and corporative sector were present at the online meeting. Dr. Vadim **Kozyulin**, PhD in political science, consultant at PIR Center; and Dr. Leonid **Tsukanov**, PhD in Political Science, Consultant at PIR Center; and Mr. Oleg **Shakirov**, author of the telegram channel “Cyberwar”, member of Alumni Community of PIR Center, took part in the online meeting as speakers.

In the “blitz” mode, the participants exchanged opinions on the phenomena of cyberterrorism and hacktivism, and also assessed the prospects for wider use of ICT technologies for military purposes, especially in the context of defrosting a number of long-standing conflicts in the Middle East. The moderator of the discussion, Leonid **Tsukanov**, thanked the participants and emphasized the prospects for further interaction between the expert groups of the two organizations.

“The digital world development is continuing by a rapid pace – and the Middle East is not an exclusion there. Development of links in cyberspace not only opens opportunities in the region but poses threats. Our purpose – figure out what outweighs today”, – Dr. Leonid **Tsukanov**, Consultant at PIR Center, stressed.



On May 7, 2024, we [conducted](#) an interview with Dr. Alexey **Arbatov**, Head of the Center for International Security at IMEMO RAS, member of PIR Center's Advisory Board. During the conversation, we discussed the concept and main principles of strategic stability; the difference between the launch under attack and the launch on warning concept; and the future of the Russian-American dialogue on arms control.



On August 2, 2024, the Second Session of the Preparatory Committee (PrepCom) for the Eleventh Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) Review Conference concluded in Geneva.

Accordingly, PIR Center [interviewed](#) Dr. Tariq **Rauf**, Director of SIPRI's Disarmament, Arms Control and Non-proliferation Program, Board Member of Atomic Reporters, and Member of the PIR Center Advisory Board. During the conversation, we discussed the workflow during the 2024 PrepCom; Russia-NATO debates over the New START agreement and the ongoing conflict in Ukraine, focusing on ZNPP.



On June 6, 2024, PIR Center [interviewed](#) Dr Kirill **Barsky**, Head of the Department of Diplomacy at MGIMO University, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary. During the conversation, we discussed the future

of the "Greater Eurasian Partnership," the ambivalence of the contemporary global security architecture, and the modern security threats and interstate political tensions hindering deeper cooperation.

In July, we [deliberated](#) with Dr. Dmitry **Polikanov**, Deputy Head of Rossotrudnichestvo. During the conversation, we discussed the concept of Russian soft power, whether it is an effective instrument in international relations and various aspects of the definition of soft power.

In December, 2023, the Security Index Occasional Paper Series **came out** with the new report “The Potential of the Semiconductor Industry in Russia in the Context of Great Power Competition” by Shakhboz **Juraev**.

This research analyses the potential of the Russian semiconductor industry to assess the technological and technical capacity of an actor in international relations. Methods of SWOT analysis and questionnaires among experts are used to get clearer estimations about the industrial environment of semiconductors in Russia.

On April 26, 2024, the Security Index Occasional Paper Series **came out** with the new report “Dealing with the Royal Australian Navy’s SSN Capability: Risk Reduction Options” by Mr. Vladimir **Ladanov**.

This research paper examines the implications of the emergence of the Royal Australian Navy’s (RAN’s) nuclear-powered submarine (SSN) capability for Russia’s security, namely the safety of its submarine-based strategic nuclear deterrent operated by the Pacific Fleet from its base in Vilyuchinsk on the Kamchatka Peninsula.

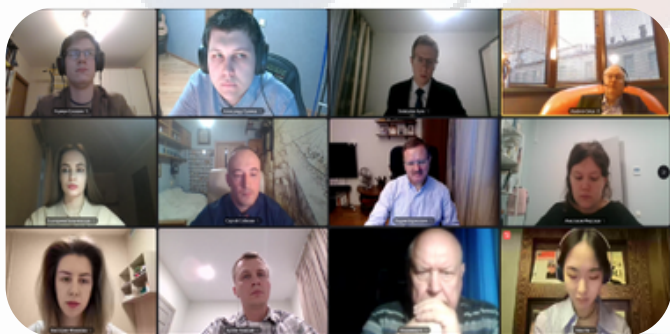

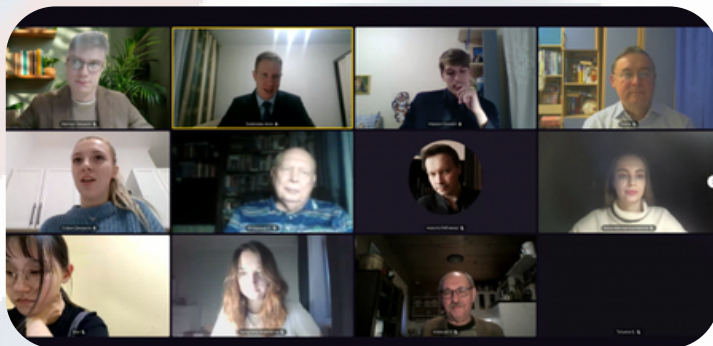

**On November 22, 2024, [PIR Center conducted an expert seminar to discuss the report titled “Prospects for Cooperation Between Russia and African and the Persian Gulf States in the Peaceful Use of Nuclear Energy”](#)**. Sviatoslav **Arov**, Research Fellow at PIR Center, presented the results of a comprehensive study, emphasizing the growing interest of African nations in developing nuclear energy due to population growth and the urgent need for electrification, particularly in regions with limited access to electricity. He highlighted financial and political barriers that hinder the implementation of large-scale projects. Special attention was given to the potential construction of small modular reactors and floating nuclear power plants in African countries. At the end of the seminar, the participants agreed that the success of nuclear projects in Africa.

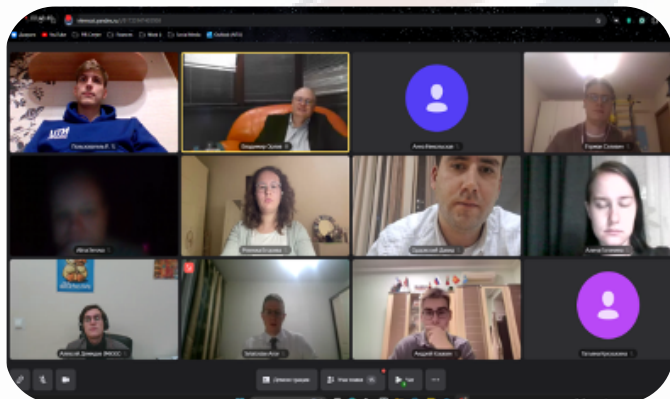

On October 25, 2024, PIR Center [interviewed](#) Dr. Dmitry **Evstafiev**, Professor of the Department of Theory of Law and State at Peoples' Friendship University of Russia, Member of the *Security Index Yearbook* Editor Board. During the discussion we deliberated the results of the BRICS Summit in Kazan, influence of BRICS expanding on forming the new world order, domestic dynamic of organization in the conditions of diversity of its states-members, the Middle East conflict and the BRICS role in its mediation.

In October, 2024, PIR Center [interviewed](#) Mr. Gleb **Efremov**, the Director General at the International Uranium Enrichment Center. During the discussion, were issued the following



topics: the initiative to create nuclear energy platforms of the BRICS countries and the role of BRICS in condemning terrorist attacks on energy infrastructure and the possibility of uniting to promote the renewal of the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action on the Iranian Nuclear Deal. Also, during the interview, the issue of the prospects for cooperation between member-states of the association in the field of peaceful uses of nuclear energy was raised.

# BRIDGES OF COOPERATION: RUSSIAN-AFRICAN FORUM ON SECURITY AND DEVELOPMENT



**From October 1 to 6, 2024**, Moscow hosted the first Russian-African Forum of Young International Relations Professionals on Security and Development, organized by PIR Center in partnership with Rossotrudnichestvo and MGIMO University.

The event brought together diplomats, military personnel, politicians, and representatives from science, education, technology, and media from various African countries, including the Republic of Congo, Somalia, Tanzania, Ethiopia, South Africa, and others. Among the participants were also students of the International Security master's program, jointly implemented by PIR Center and MGIMO. The Forum provided a unique opportunity for attendees to attend lectures from leading Russian experts and engage in discussions.

"We established this Forum to address reality – to have solutions-oriented discussions, not just to list problems," – Dr. Vladimir **Orlov**, Founding Director of PIR Center, noted.

The Forum provided a unique opportunity for attendees to attend lectures from leading Russian experts and engage in discussions, sharing their diverse perspectives on critical security issues that impact Africa and the world.

The official opening ceremony occurred at MGIMO, where Dr. Andrey **Baykov**, MGIMO Vice-Rector for Science and Research, [expressed hope that the Forum would become a platform for developing collaborative approaches to international security challenges.](#)



# BRIDGES OF COOPERATION: RUSSIAN-AFRICAN FORUM ON SECURITY AND DEVELOPMENT

One of the key highlights of the Forum was the [seminar](#) led by Mikhail **Margelov**, Head of the UNESCO Department at the Institute of Asian and African Studies, Moscow State University, and PIR Center Advisory Board member. This session centered on conflict resolution, using the peace process and the end of the civil war in Sudan as a case study.

Mikhail **Margelov** mentioned that significant issues in Africa, such as resource shortages, terrorism, and radicalization, require comprehensive solutions. He pointed out successful examples of peaceful negotiations, such as those in South Sudan, where diplomacy proved more effective than military interventions.

He also discussed the prospects for expanding economic cooperation between Russia and Africa, particularly in resource-based projects, highlighting opportunities to strengthen bilateral ties.

At the Forum, participants also attended the [lecture](#) by Dmitry **Polikanov**, Deputy Head of the Federal Agency for CIS Affairs, Compatriots Living Abroad, and International Humanitarian Cooperation (Rossotrudnichestvo).

He highlighted the importance of strengthening partnerships between Russia and African nations, particularly regarding security issues. Additionally, Dmitry **Polikanov** noted the growing interest from African countries in Russian IT applications and healthcare technologies.

Furthermore, Dr. Sergey **Kostelyanets**, Head of the Center for Sociological and Political Research at the Institute of Africa, Russian Academy of Sciences, addressed the significant topic of neocolonialism and its impact on Africa's political and economic development. He particularly underscored that the continent's dependence on external investments remains a major obstacle to sustainable growth, positioning Africa as a strategic source of raw materials for global economies.

One of the Forum's pivotal sessions involved African participants sharing their views on key security threats. They analyzed the continent's most pressing issues and proposed potential solutions, fostering deeper intercultural dialogue, and strengthening cooperation between Africa and Russia. The Forum culminated in a case management game titled "Operational State Administration: How to Get the Country Out of Crisis?" where participants developed strategies for stabilizing crisis situations while practicing negotiation skills and critical thinking. The most engaged participants received printed editions of the *Security Index* Yearbook and the newly released paperwork "PIR Center: Selected Works. 1994–2024 Anthology". All participants were awarded certificates recognizing their contributions to the Forum discussions.

Throughout all days of the Forum, PIR Center and colleagues from Rossotrudnichestvo actively interviewed participants who shared their impressions of the event and their professional views on the issues raised at the Forum.

# PIR LIBRARY SERIES: NEW BOOKS FOR NEW GENERATION

On the 30th anniversary of the entry into force of **START-I**, PIR Center published Yuri **Nazarkin's** memoirs, [“On the START. On Africa. On Life: Memoirs of a Diplomat” \(in Russian\).](#)

The book is published in collaboration with the “Ves Mir” publishing house and with the support of the Presidential Grant Foundation as part of the PIR Center project *“Global Security: A View from Russia for the Youth Around the World.”*



The publication of the new book within the “PIR Library” series is timed to coincide with the 30th anniversary of the entry into force of the Strategic Offensive Arms Reduction Treaty, or **START-I**, which was achieved with the participation of Ambassador Nazarkin as head of the Soviet delegation at the respective Soviet-American negotiations. It was signed on **July 31, 1991**, and entered into force on **December 5, 1994**, enduring such significant turmoil as the Soviet Union collapse and the resolution of the issue of the Soviet nuclear legacy.

Amb. Yuri **Nazarkin** is a former Russian diplomat and statesman: Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the USSR and the Russian Federation, representative of the USSR at the Conference on Disarmament (1987–1989), head of the Soviet delegation to negotiations with the United States on nuclear and space weapons (1989-1991), Deputy Secretary of the Security Council of the Russian Federation (1992–1995).

Experts often describe **START-I** as both “unique” and “revolutionary,” as it laid the foundation for strengthening mutual trust between Russia and the United States over the years.

Dr. Vladimir **Orlov**, Founding Director of PIR Center, has recently met with Ambassador Yuri **Nazarkin**, a member of the PIR Center Advisory Board, and received from him a signed copy of his memoirs.
